### **RESOLUTION NO. 18-01**

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE, TEXAS, DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE CANVASS FOR THE ELECTION RETURNS OF THE ELECTION OF MAY 5, 2018, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND TWO MEMBERS OF COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Lakewood Village, Texas, duly ordered a general election to be held in said Town on May 5, 2018, for the purpose of electing a mayor and two members of the Town Council of the Town of Lakewood Village; and

**WHEREAS**, proper notice of said election was duly and legally given and that said election was held in accordance with the election laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, a Canvass of the Election including the returns was conducted on May 10, 2018; and

**WHEREAS**, it was found that the persons herein named received the following votes for said term of office on the Town Council of the Town of Lakewood Village:

Mayor Dr. Mark E. Vargus received 175 or 66.04% of the votes cast;

**Council, Place 6**, **Brent Ashton** received 90 or 33.96% of the votes cast;

Council, Place 2, Darrell West was unopposed and received 196 or 100% of votes cast

**Council Place 4. Serena Lepley** was unopposed and received 206 or 100% of the votes cast;

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE, TEXAS:

**SECTION 1.** The findings set forth above are incorporated into the body of this Resolution as if fully set forth herein.

**SECTION 2.** Dr. Mark E. Vargus is hereby declared to be duly elected as Mayor, Place 6.

**SECTION 3.** Darrell West is hereby declared to be duly elected as Council Member, Place 2.

**SECTION 4.** Serena Lepley is hereby declared to be duly elected as Council Member Place 4.

**SECTION 5.** The Lakewood Village Town Council hereby finds and determines, as a result of the Canvass, held on May 10, 2018, that a combined, Early Voting and Election Day, total of 265 ballots were cast in the Election, with 227 early ballots cast, and 37 Election Day ballots cast as indicated by the poll list for the Election held on May 5, 2018.

**SECTION 6.** It is hereby declared that the Town Council of Lakewood Village approves and accepts the results of the Election for Mayor Place 6, Council Place 2, and Council Place 4, as determined by the vote of the qualified voters of the Town of Lakewood Village as set out in the Summary of Returns, Exhibit A.

**SECTION 7.** This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage by the Lakewood Village Town Council.

With a quorum of the Council Members present, Mayor Vargus called the Regular Meeting of the Town Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 8, 2018, in the Council Chambers of the Lakewood Village Town Hall, 100 Highridge Drive, Lakewood Village, Texas.

A public hearing was held to provide an opportunity for citizens to comment on the requested variance to allow a front facing garage at 807 Carrie Lane. Mayor Vargus opened the public hearing at 7:04 p.m.

No one requested to speak.

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**MOTION:** 

Upon a motion made by Mayor Pro-Tem Reed and seconded by Councilman Tantalo, council voted five (5) "ayes", no (0) "nays" to close the public hearing at 7:04 pm. *The motion carried*.

REGULAR AGENDA: (Agenda Item D)

Consideration of Variance Request to Allow Front Facing Garage at 807 Carrie Lane (Asbell)

(Agenda Item D.3)

Eric Farage reported that the secondary structure will be 280 feet away from the road. The addition will be used as a home for a relative with a rare disease that requires the home to be ADA compliant. Due to the ADA restrictions and the layout of the lot the location of the structure is limited to one area which requires the structure to have a front facing garage and it will very slightly encroach into the side-yard setback. Councilman Tantalo inquired about the process of approval because the flatwork is already in place. Mr. Farage reported that he stopped the construction when he realized that he needed a variance because of the distance of the ramp. There was some discussion about the current restrictions on location and layout of secondary structures and the front facing garage requirement.

Upon a motion made by Councilman Bushong and seconded by Councilman Newsome, council voted five (5) "ayes", no (0) "nays" to approve the variance for the front facing garage at 807 Carrie Lane as requested. *The motion carried*.

Consideration of International Dark Skies Association Certification (Asbell)

(Agenda Item D.1)

Mayor Vargus reported that Mayor Pro-Tem Reed and Sheryl France have dedicated a great deal of time investigating the possibility of achieving the Dark Skies Certification. Mayor Vargus stated that he wanted to bring this item to council to receive direction from council before tasking staff to spend time on the application.

Mayor Pro-Tem Reed reported that the town joined the Dark Skies Association for a membership fee of \$35.00. Mayor Pro-Tem Reed stated that he believes there is an advantage to the town to have a consistent lighting policy. The town currently has several different types of street lights in town and a consistent lighting policy would be more aesthetically pleasing and environmentally friendly. Mayor Pro-Teem Reed reviewed some of the requirements of the application process and the steps for approval as a Dark Skies Community. Mayor Vargus reported that it is virtually impossible for larger cities to achieve the Dark Skies designation

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because of the lighting for commercial establishments and major roadways that is already in place. Lakewood Village is in a position that is unique because a great deal of our development has not yet occurred. The requirements are practical and easy for Lakewood Village to meet. Mayor Pro-Tem Reed reported that the town has only 30 street lights and those could be replaced at the time new development comes in. Councilman Bushong stated that he believes this is the right time for Lakewood Village to put this plan in place. CoServ is testing two sets of new lights at the intersection of Hillside and Shoreline and the intersection of Peninsula and Shoreline that are Dark Skies approved. Mayor Pro-Tem Reed invited everyone to drive by and provide feedback on the lights. Councilman Newsome reported that the light pollution has quadrupled in the time that he has lived here and he supports the effort to standardize and control lighting.

Councilman Tantalo stated that he is concerned about priorities and requirements stated by this organization. Councilman Tantalo stated that he believes the town should pass an ordinance establishing the town priorities rather than joining an organization that requires compliance with their lighting regulations. Mayor Vargus stated that the purpose of this agenda item is to get feedback from the council about whether or not the council supports the idea of this effort before tasking Town Secretary Asbell to complete the application for certification. Councilwoman Shields asked about the timeline for compliance and maintenance of the designation. There was some discussion about the difference in pricing between International Dark Skies Association compliant and non-compliant light fixtures. Councilwoman Shields reported that she found a city in California that implemented Dark Skies fixtures which resulted in an 80% savings on their electric costs. There was some discussion about the cost of replacing street lights with compliant fixtures and the portion of the cost covered by CoServ. There was some discussion about the benefit of establishing a policy for consistent lighting requirements throughout the town. Councilwoman Shields stated that she is interested in the cost savings benefit of the effort. Mayor Pro-Tem Reed reported that the applications of other cities are available on the websites of International Dark Skies Association and the Texas Dark Skies Association. There was discussion about moving forward and the next steps in the process of applying for certification.

If not platted, a metes and bounds legal description of the property.

A written statement documenting the reason for the variance(s), including evidence that the request complies with the following criteria as required for approval of a variance.

- 1) A unique physical condition exists within or adjacent to the subject tract or structure(s) located thereon which distinguishes it from other similarly situated, and which creates an exceptional hardship, difficulty, or inequity that would result from literal enforcement of the ordinance;
- 2) The condition or characteristic noted above is not caused by an action of the property owner, occupant, or applicant;
- 3) The variance is the minimum amount necessary to allow a reasonable use of the property;
- 4) The sole reason for the variance is not a desire of the owner, occupant, or applicant for increased financial gain or reduced financial hardship;
- 5) The variance will not adversely affect public health or safety, and will not substantially or permanently interfere with the appropriate use of adjacent conforming property in the same district; and,
- 6) The variance will not alter the essential character of the zoning district within which the subject property is located, and is in harmony with the intent and purposes of the zoning ordinance.

- 1) Scale and north arrow;
- 2) Location of site with respect to streets and adjacent properties;
- 3) Property lines and dimensions;
- 4) Location and dimensions of buildings;
